1. Dress Code: (Girls initial all, guys initial all except those specified "Female")

BEGINS at the meeting **June 3rd** and ends when you get home **June 18th** unless otherwise specified.

Females: swimsuits must be one piece or cover the belly button. All swimsuits must be modest.

Males: May wear any shorts type swimsuits that do not reveal underwear.

Females: No short shorts or skirts

Females: No spaghetti strap shirts or one shouldered shirts unless you are already on the beach and it is over your swimsuit.

Males & Females: No underwear should show.

Females: Anything that shows any cleavage is unacceptable.

Anything see through is unacceptable.

Females: Girls need to wear bras when not in swimsuits.

No questionable logos about alcohol, drugs, sex, violence, etc. Also no secular band shirts, please.

Wonder-wear: If you have to wonder if it's okay to wear, please do not wear it.

**Note: The students' youth group leaders may not have the same standards we have set for you. Their only rule is the swimsuit rule. We will suggest modest dress from the platform, but will leave the enforcement to the individual youth pastors.*

2. Appropriate Physical Touch And Interaction:

These rules are for the legal protection of the conference and you, as well as an overall modesty, which is respectable.

- ❖ In dealing with students and leaders, there needs to be no public affection shown.
- ❖ Leaders may not date students attending the conference while they are at the conference.
- ❖ Leaders may not sit on laps or have any one sit in his or her lap. This includes students, adults and other leaders.
- ❖ When dealing with students, only side arm hugs will be deemed as appropriate.
- ❖ There is to be no one on one counseling between a male leader and a female student and vice versa.
- ❖ Leaders are not to be the only one in a cabin while a student is changing clothes.
- ❖ There is to be absolutely no physical contact with students that could be taken as more than buddy like.
- ❖ There is to be no language which suggests inappropriate physical or other inappropriate behavior to students or leaders.
- ❖ There is to be no suggestive body language made by leaders.
- ❖ Leaders must maintain modesty at all times.
- ❖ There is to be no discussion about any student or leader's physical (specifically-body) appearance.
- ❖ D-Leaders may only go in cabins of their same gender

3. Displays of Affection/Counselor Dating Policy:

If D-Leaders are dating, that is fine. But there needs to be no physical affection shown by non-married couples during the conference (from the D-Leader meeting until home). This includes holding hands, kissing (even goodnight), sitting on laps, etc. There needs to be complete focus from staff and students on the goal for the week: helping students grow. Any time it is possible to hang out with students, D-group leaders need to do so instead of couples or groups of D-Leaders going off alone.

4. Behavior Code:

Each leader will be responsible to those running and helping with the camp: Jonathan and Lisa Moore, Lee McBride, Todd Quintard and Doug Compton. If one of these leaders or someone they have put in charge asks a D-Leaders to help with something, the leader is responsible to do his or her best work in accomplishing the task with a willing, helpful demeanor.

5. What Not To Bring:

Illegal drugs, alcohol, tobacco in any form, weapons or knives of any form.

6. Attitude and Speech:

Phil. 2:3-11- “Your attitude should be the same as that of Christ Jesus, who being in very nature God didn’t consider equality with God something to be grasped but made Himself nothing, taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness, And being found in appearance as a man He humbled Himself and became obedient to death, even death on a cross! There fore God has exalted Him to the highest place that at the name of Jesus every knee shall bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus is Lord to the glory of God the father.”

Words– All speech about other D leaders, conference leaders and all others should be that which is useful to build them, and others up.

Gossip and grumbling should be avoided, since they only serve to tear down the body of Christ.

With students, D-leaders should avoid in depth discussions about their own past sins in the following areas: sex, drugs, alcohol, brawling. It is better to put more focus on Christ and His victories.

7. Responsibilities:

•***The first responsibility each D-Leader has is to fulfill his or her obligation to be present at Souled Out during the days specified in his or her agreement form, including the leaders meeting.*** The leaders’ meeting on June 3rd (which will be in Columbus, GA) will last from about noon until about 6 PM. (Times may change as the day gets closer). This meeting is important training time needed to be a D-Leaders as well as fellowship and worship with the team. More details will be given later.

•**Other responsibilities will include:**

- ❖ Leading discussions with a group of 8-12 middle or high school students of like gender twice a day
- ❖ Helping serve meals 2-4 times during each week, which includes being responsible to know when you are scheduled to help and being on time without being reminded
- ❖ D-Leader curfew to be in your own room is midnight.

•**And may include:**

- ❖ D-Leader skits

- ❖ All males will help with load in and out of PA and other equipment at the beginning and end of S.O.
- ❖ Depending on your application, you may help with: photography, help with video, registration, selling product before or after worship sessions (which also requires you to know when to be where and be on time without reminders), music, providing rec. assistance to Todd, cleanup of worship center, etc. You will need to keep track of any responsibility you are given and make sure you are where you need to be when you are scheduled to be there.

8. Avoiding Situations in which a D-Leader could be a stumbling block.

We at Souled Out realize that there are some gray areas in the bible. We do not want to regulate every area of a D-leaders life. However, there are some areas in the bible that are black and white in spelling out how not to be a stumbling block to other believers. One of these areas is drinking alcohol (see Romans 14). We never want our freedom to come at the expense of a brother or sister's faith. We would rather do what is most beneficial to the body of Christ. In signing this blank you are agreeing to abstain from alcohol and other questionable things, even right before or after Souled Out. You are agreeing to not be in situations where you could be a stumbling block in this manner.

9. Subject Matter:

D-leaders need to avoid conversations with students about the following issues. These issues are ones that the denominations present do not hold in common. We are most concerned that we share Christ and Him resurrected. We all agree on that. You may direct students to talk with their own Youth Pastors if they need to talk about the following subjects: Second filling, tongues, "once saved always saved"/"Losing your salvation" and "dunking" vs. sprinkle baptism.

We want to make sure D-leaders understand our stand on homosexuality. Because the Bible calls homosexuality a sin, homosexuality is not an option to live a pure life as a Christian. If the subject comes up, be sensitive and very careful *and* include the student's Youth Pastor in the discussion, if the student is exploring the idea.

10. Spending time with students:

Last but definitely not least is time with students. Each leader must realize that he or she is here for the students. Each leader needs to do anything he/she can to build a bond with the students in his or her Disciple group. The group time is crucial. But even beyond that, individuals in your group will open up more in group time if they have gotten to know you outside of group time.

*Note- D-Leaders may not take a student *anywhere* (alone *nor* with others) in their car or off campus from Laguna or the beach directly across from Laguna.

It is very important that D-Leaders look for opportunities to spend time on the beach, at the pool and at meals and free time getting to know their groups' individuals. Many students may be more willing to talk with you one on one about their relationship with God then rather than during group time. If there is a time when your group members are unavailable, it also never hurts to make friends with students in other groups. It all comes down to building students up in their faith
